



BOIDIER HURST SCOUT CAMP SITE - Conditions of use

- a. The Boidier Hurst Management Committee requires the person signing the booking form as Camp Leader for either Scout Association or external organisations to take responsibility for ensuring that all adults that are invited onto site or stay overnight with a camp have Criminal Records Bureau clearance.
- b. The rules of the Site must be observed at all times. Failure to comply could mean expulsion from the Site by either the warden or a member of the management committee.
- a. Please take care when using the access from The Box Hill Road to the Site as this is a bridleway and provides access to other properties. Vehicles must be driven SLOWLY, especially past the stables.
- b. Boidier Hurst will not accept liability for damage, loss or theft of campers or visitors property from the site.
- c. When young campers are on Site without a Leader for example a Patrol camp, the name and telephone number of an adult responsible for them must be given to the warden.
- d. Vehicles are not allowed on the numbered camping sites.

Site Rules

1. Scout and Guide members must arrive in correct uniform
2. Campers and visitors to report to the Warden on arrival and departure.
3. At the discretion of the Warden, unloading and loading may be carried out on the main track adjacent to the individual site(s). Vehicles must return to the car park as soon as they have been unloaded.
4. Pits must not be dug. Dirty water must be filtered through buckets, (available from the Warden). Natural filter material to be used then burnt or removed from site and disposed of with normal rubbish.
5. All rubbish to be taken away on departure. If on a longer stay, please see the notice board for details of a local disposal site.
6. Turfs must not be cut under any circumstances. Use the altar or slab bases for cooking and open fires and by arrangement with the Warden, the camp fire circle.
7. Growing timber must not be cut or damaged.
8. Washing up must not be undertaken at the water taps or in the toilet block (except at the outside washing up sinks) as the waste food blocks the drains and floods the areas around the taps.
9. The cleanliness of the toilets is the responsibility of all campers. Where more than one group is on site the Warden will organise a cleaning rota.
10. To protect the function of the septic tank, chemical toilets are not allowed.
11. For safety, the use of motor cycles, go-karts, cycles, guns, catapults and archery is prohibited on Site.
12. All accidents must be reported to the Warden and recorded in the accidentbook at Royden House.
13. Dogs are not encouraged. If they are temporarily on site, they must be on a lead and any mess cleared up.
14. If the Heath is to be used for activities, the National Trust Warden must be told (Tel: 01372 375552) and the National Trust rules respected.
15. Before departure, the site used and/or the Manly Building must be inspected by the warden or a member of the Management Committee.
16. Please be considerate to others by keeping noise to a minimum between 22.30 hrs and 7.00 hrs.
17. Please do not waste electricity, gas, water or wood.
